Ethics: Insurance Conflicts Counsel

The "tripartite relationship" between a policyholder/defendant, defense counsel and the insurance company providing a defense sometimes leads to conflicts of interest, as when the insurance company furnishes a defense under a reservation of rights letter and some approaches to defense or settlement may militate against coverage. In addition, conflicts can be subtle, as when defense counsel is hesitant to pursue coverage against an insurer-employer. This session will enumerate the conflicts and policyholder rights.
